

Celebrate 1838 June 23, 2018

180 years ago Metamora was platted along the proposed course of the Whitewater Canal, one of the infrastructure efforts funded initially by Indiana's Mammoth Internal Improvement Act of 1836.

We're going to revisit the village of Metamora as it was reflected in the 1865 map. We hope to provide insight into the businesses and families in the town at that time.

The Opry Barn

Last summer Historic Metamora took a big step and purchased the old warehouse building and the small stone building at the west end of town where the tomato canning factory operated. Metamora Performing Arts has rented the structure for the past few years and operated it as the Opry Barn, and other space in the building was used as storage by Historic Metamora and the Merchant's Association of Metamora. With support from those two organizations and the Lion's Club of Metamora we hope to continue to expand and improve activities held at the barn.

One of our first large projects will be to raise money to improve the building by installing air conditioning. Any donations to this effort would be greatly appreciated.
